Script:

Since 1949, Blind Babies Foundation has been providing critical early intervention and education services to infants and preschoolers who are blind or visually impaired and their families.

Our professionally trained VIS work closely with families in 14 Central and Northern California Counties at no cost to the families.

Script:

Gail Calvello, one of our program directors and a VIS for over 25 years, will share some of her insights about Blind Babies Foundation.

Script:

Hello I'm Gail Calvello. I'm a program director with the Blind Babies Foundation. I'm a credentialed teacher of the visually impaired and within our agency we refer to ourselves as vision impairment specialists.

Visual Description:

Revised video from ABC Channel 7 News of Jeri Hart working with Tyler and his mom in their home. They are opening and shutting cupboard doors, the refrigerator, and silverware drawers and practicing putting a lid on a yogurt container. Tyler is three years old (?) has both visual and motor impairments. He is an active, curious child with fair hair and skin.

Script:

The work we do with the parents is reality based. We work in the home with the families doing the things parents would do with typically developing children.

We help the family to set up the environment so the child can use his vision the best that he can.

If the child doesn't have any functional vision, we work on compensatory skills to help the child develop as normally as possible using other strategies.

We talk a lot about working with real things. You wouldn't give a child a plastic banana and teach him that that's a banana. A child needs to know what a real banana is, what it feels like what it smells like...

Visual Description:

Tyler looking at a book and playing with toys with Jeri Hart and his mom.

Script:

We use all the normal objects you find in the home so the child will understand what we are talking about when we use language.

Visual Description:

Tyler is standing with his mom's help and then walking over to Jeri with his walker. He is walking towards a red, shiny pom pom that Jeri is holding.

Script:

One of the most important milestones for most parents is when their child begins to walk. We call that orientation and mobility.

Visual Description:

Tyler is looking at books, playing with toys and crawling.

Script:

What many people don't understand is that the impact of a severe vision loss affects all areas of development.

Why does a child reach for something? Because they see something to reach for. Likewise why does a child tend to crawl? Because they see something that they want to get to.

Visual Description:

Footage from Beeper Egg Hunt of children participating in the egg hunt who are gently guided by their parents. Young girl using her walker to walk towards beeping egg, picking it up with the help of her mother and brother.

Script:

In order to compensate for poor vision we use the parent or a noisy object to entice the child to move forward.

Visual Description:

Business owner (?) and his daughters handing out lovely Easter baskets to families.

Script:

Seeing the children grow and develop is a wonderful part of our work but it's not the most rewarding part. The most rewarding part is to see the parent begin to relax and to enjoy the child's development.

Visual Description:

Little girl's beautiful smile as she opens an Easter egg she found.

Visual Description:

Large black labrador pulling child around in a cart at the Beeper Egg Hunt, winding through a crowd of families enjoying the food and festivities of the day.

Script:

Visual Impairment Specialists like Gail Calvello are teachers and advocates. The work they do with Blind Babies Floundation has a profound affect on families.

Visual Description:

Word graphic listing services offered through Blind Babies Foundation.

Script:

Blind Babies Foundation provides parent education and home-based early intervention services, accompanies families on important medical visits, brings families together to meet and learn from one another provides information and resources to families and professionals, refers families to community programs, advocates for children and families.

Visual Description:

Footage from Beeper Egg Hunt of children planting and painting. An Aztec dancer is holding baby at celebration with Guide Dogs for the Blind. Families are participating in Harvest Party and the anual golf tournament, "Swing for Kids".
